



#### WHAT IS RECONCILIATION?

The **Honourable Justice Murray Sinclair**, Chair of the Truth & Reconciliation Commission of Canada:

"Reconciliation is about forging and maintaining respectful relationships: there are no short cuts. Getting to reconciliation will be much harder than getting to the truth. It is not an Aboriginal problem, it is a Canadian problem."

Shelagh Rogers, CBC, quoting author Richard Wagamese:

"Reconciliation begins when you lean over the fence and ask me how I am. In my language."






