




Gullah-Geechee in Georgia

Coastal Georgia's Gullah-Geechee people are descendants of enslaved Africans from plantations along the lower Atlantic coast. Many came from West African rice-growing regions and were brought to the Americas and used for their agricultural and architectural skillset.

Porch Lies, Tricksters, and Other Tall Tales

The Gullah-Geechee have a rich storytelling tradition! Sometimes animals and people play roles in stories passed down through generations! Gullah-Geechee fables, like Africa's "trixter tales," center on animals adopting human personalities and finding themselves in silly, situations.
